#### **Clarification of News Report**

Chelsea Logistics and Infrastructure Holdings Corp. would like to clarify the news article which appeared on The Manila Times which reads:

"THE third major telecommunications player chosen by the government may finally secure a few weeks from now the certificate and frequencies needed to begin operations, the Department of Information and Communications Technology (DICT) said on Sunday.

On the sidelines of the department's celebration of its third founding anniversary in Quezon City, Acting Information Secretary Eliseo Rio Jr. said the Mislatel consortium — which the National Telecommunications Commission chose last November as the telco that would challenge the so-called duopoly of PLDT Inc. and Globe Telecom Inc. — may receive them 'by the end of this month.'

He emphasized, however, that the Filipino-Chinese consortium — composed of Udenna Corp. and Chelsea Logistics Holdings Corp. of Davao City-based businessman Dennis Uy and state-run China Telecommunications Corp. — must first register with 'the Securities and Exchange Commission, at pag nakuha nila [iyon], hopefully by this coming week, ay puwede na silang pumunta sa DICT (and once they accomplish that, hopefully by this coming week, they can proceed to the DICT).'

'But they still have to post the performance bond of P25.7 billion [before the] DICT [gives the] CPNC (certificate of public convenience and necessity) [and] frequencies,' Rio said.

Once that is done, Mislatel would get frequencies in the 700 and 2100 megahertz, and 2.5, 3.3 and 3.5 gigahertz bands.
